Marylyn M. Addo is Professor of Medicine and Head of the Infectious Disease Unit at the University Medical Centre Hamburg-Eppendorf (UKE), Germany. She is the founding Director of the Institute for Infection Research and Vaccine Development (IIRVD) at UKE, where she leads research on the pathogenesis and treatment of emerging viral infections. In this context she is the speaker of the DFG-funded Collaborative Research Center 1648: Emerging viruses: Pathogenesis, Structure, Immunity (www.crc1648.de). After receiving her medical degree, Prof. Addo pursued specialized training in infectious diseases and tropical medicine in Germany, Switzerland, the UK, and the USA. Her team's work has contributed to the development of vaccine candidates against Ebola and MERS, as well as in the global response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Internationally recognized for her contributions to vaccine and therapeutic strategies against emerging infectious diseases, Prof. Addo has significantly advanced the field of vaccinology, particularly during global health emergencies.
